Israel arrived at Sinai same day of week as they left Rameses → 4
Wash Clothes → 5
7th Sabbath toward Pentecost → 6
Sunset begins the Day → 14
Example of Hebrew calendar day (about 24 hrs.) → 14

50 Pentecost 50th day after 7th Sabbath 3

Not Pentecost because it would have required washing clothes on Sabbath 4

2 Sacred Calendar: On the Hebrew (Sacred) calendar *sunset* begins the new day. The Gregorian calendar, which is utilized today, is different. It begins the day at midnight.
